
Support Services 13%

Additional staff called **reading interventionists** are making a huge difference for our younger students. A program known as Level Up at our secondary level is allowing high school students to make up lost ground. Our teachers and other staff are working harder than ever to create successful outcomes for our students.

While decreasing COVID cases allowed us to drop our mask mandate in February, we continue to ensure our buildings are thoroughly cleaned. Our custodians deserve recognition for the extra work they've put in to help create a healthy learning environment.

More than 700 students K-12 chose to attend school online this year through our expanded Achieve Virtual schools. We will continue to provide that option for our students.


